





MHBA/MHYF Election Time is Near!

2022 MHBA and MHYF Election Process

The election process for the Miniature Hereford Breeders Association (MHBA) and the Miniature Hereford Youth Foundation (MHYF) takes several months to complete. I would like to walk you through the steps that are taken to insure a proper election is provided.

The MHBA Secretary is constantly keeping accurate records of the Associations membership roster as this is critical to our election process. Prior to the election process beginning, the MHBA Secretary will contact the Accounting firm and complete all necessary contracting documents. On the day the election process is to begin (Friday, March 4, 2022) the Secretary will make a list of all current eligible voting members who hold a paid Family Membership in the MHBA. Each of these members will then be sent by mail an official nomination packet (as per Article II, Section 11 of the By-Laws). This packet will include

any nomination information needed (what positions are up for election, nomination criteria, nomination form, and the nomination return deadline, etc.).

Keep in mind that there are some stipulations that apply to the MHBA and MHYF elections regarding nominating and voting eligibility. Article III, Section 1 states that "to qualify for a position on the MHBA Board as well as one of the nine Regional Director positions,

a candidate must be an individual and presently a Member in Good Standings (a MGS is an individual with a minimum of three consecutive preceding years as a paid Family member prior to the current election cycle)." Also, according to Article II, Section 11, "Executive Board of Directors may be nominated and voted on by all MHBA paid members holding a current Family Membership. Members of the nine Regions shall nominate and vote on members from their own Region to represent them as their corresponding Regional Director."

When a member receives their official nomination packet, they are able to complete the nomination form and return to the MHBA Secretary via mail prior to the established nomination deadline. As the nomination forms are received by the MHBA Secretary, he/she will add the names to a Nomination Roster. After the nominee's name is added to

the roster, their vetting process begins with the MHBA and MHYF Secretaries working together to properly vet each individual nominated. During the vetting process the Secretaries check to see if the person holds a current "Member in Good Standings" status (being a current paid member for a minimum of three consecutive years or longer prior to the current election process) according to the MHBA By-Laws. If the nominee





does not qualify, they are notified by their Secretary (MHBA or MHYF) and provided the reason for their non-qualification at that point. If the nominee does qualify to hold office, they are contacted and asked if they accept their nomination. If they accept the nomination, their name is moved to the official ballot list: if they decline. their name is moved to a declined nomination list. The completed nomination list as well as a list of all the positions that are

available for the current election cycle is then sent by the Secretary to the independent Accounting firm to be used as the secondary double check.

After the nomination deadline has passed and the nominees are vetted, the MHBA Secretary will make sure that all qualified candidate names are properly placed on the Official Ballot. The MHBA Secretary will then mail an Official Ballot packet to the independent Accounting firm, as well as to all eligible MHBA Family level memberships, with a return envelope to the MHBA's Independent Accounting firm (Article II, Section 10). As members complete his/

her ballot, it is important to note that the Official ballots are not returned to the MHBA Secretary or any other member of either Board. The ballots instead are mailed directly to the independent Accounting firm where they will be tallied. The results are blind tallied and the MHBA Secretary will never be informed of the votes submitted by individual members. The results of that tally will be sent directly to the MHBA Secretary only, where he/

she will make record of the official results. It is then the Secretaries duty to contact each individual who has been officially elected and inform them of their selection. Candidates that were not elected will be notified and thanked for their participation in the MHBA/MHYF elections. The results of the election will then be made available to all MHBA members via several avenues (website, Facebook, email).

Whew....yes, it does take that long, but it is well worth it. The MHBA and the MHYF encourage our members to participate by voting in our election process.

In order to be eligible to participate (make nominations and vote) in the upcoming 2022 MHBA/MHYF election process, you will need to be a current paid Family member of the Miniature Hereford Breeders Association. In order to run for one of the Board positions available in the MHBA or MHYF, you will need to hold a Member in Good Standings level of membership. Our election period for the 2022 year will begin on Friday, March 4th at 11:59pm. At that time the MHBA Secretary will make an election roster of the paid Family membership. An official Nomination form will be sent to all those on that list by mail (Monday, March 7th). 2022 is going full force!

With the amazing growth of our breed across the US, the Miniature Hereford Breeders Association is continuing the AIME points program. These AIME programs are available to our MHBA membership again at no cost again for the 2022 calendar year, so be sure to get your applications in early so that you can be accumulating points. The MHBA feels that having sanctioned shows

promote consistency throughout the Nation in terms of Miniature Hereford show rules, policies, expectations, and class offerings.

The MHBA AIME Points program for Open Shows are recognized as the "AIME Cattle of Excellence" awards. Within this program, we recognize three (3) individual animals each year for their achievements in Excellence

during that calendar year. These award recipients will be acknowledged as the:

- MHBA Female of Excellence
- MHBA Bull of Excellence
- MHBA Prospect Steer of Excellence

All MHBA membership levels are eligible to submit AIME Cattle of Excellence program application(s). These members may enroll as many individual Miniature Herefords as desired into the Program and participate in as many MHBA Sanctioned shows as they would like. Only the top four (4) scores from the individual AIME Points shows, in which a given animal was exhibited, will count towards a final total Excellence score for each individual animal. Therefore, in theory, a single Cattle of Excellence program applicant may participate in more than four shows; however, only their top four scores will be calculated in the Excellence competitions.

The second AIME Points program members are encouraged to participate in is the "AIME Ranch of Distinction" Program. In this program, we recognize three individual Ranches/Farms each year for their achievements in the show ring during that calendar year. These awards will be offered in three different levels of competition:

- MHBA Ranch of Distinction I (1-3 head exhibited)
- MHBA Ranch of Distinction II (4-6 head exhibited)
- MHBA Ranch of Distinction III (7-10 head exhibited)

All current MHBA Family membership levels are eligible to compete in the AIME Ranch of Distinction Program and may enter as many MHBA Sanctioned shows each year as they would like. Only the top four (4) total scores for their Ranch/Farm exhibits from each MHBA Sanctioned show will count towards their total final score. For further information, Program details, and Program applications, please visit the MHBA website and click on the AIME tab.

The third AIME Points program is the "Junior AIME Animals of Excellence" program, which are specifically for MHBA youth members (ages 3 to 21). Within this program, we will recognize two (2) individual animals exhibited by MHBA youth in MHBA Junior Sanctioned

shows each year, for their achievements in Excellence. This Program began in June 2021 at the MHBA/MHYF Junior Nationals held in Duncan, OK. Be sure to apply to participate in the Junior AIME program as all your spring shows will count towards your point totals. The Junior AIME Animals of Excellence Program year will last from June to June so the first Jr AIME awards will be presented at the 2022 Miniature Hereford Junior Nationals held in Duncan OK. The annual award recipients will be acknowledged as the:

- MHBA Junior Female of Excellence
- MHBA Junior Prospect Steer of Excellence

In order for points to be accumulated for the Junior AIME program, the show must be recognized as an "MHBA Sanctioned Junior Show." In doing so, this means that Sanctioned Junior Shows are required to follow all MHBA Junior show rules, policies, and expectations. To see the Junior AIME Animals of Excellence Program description, detailed information, and applications, please visit the new MHBA website and click on the AIME tab. All current MHBA Junior members—those with their own Jr membership as well as those under an MHBA Family membership—are eligible to submit cattle applications. These youth exhibitors may enter as many MHBA Sanctioned Junior shows as they would like, and as many animals into the Program as desired. For each animal entered into the Program, only their top four (4) scores obtained from exhibition at MHBA Junior Sanctioned shows will be counted towards their total final score.

If you would like one of the shows that you currently attend to become an AIME Points Program show, please have your show superintendent contact your Regional Director or one of the MHBA Board members for information on how to apply. Information packets and Program applications may also be requested from the MHBA Secretary. MHBA Sanctioned shows WILL NOT be automatically enrolled into the AIME Program! Miniature Hereford cattle will likewise also NOT be automatically enrolled into respective Excellence Programs—cattle owners must submit individual applications in order to participate in the MHBA AIME points program!

Grants Are Now Open

MHYF Grants are available to assist in the funding of activities and/or junior shows specific to MHBA youth and the Miniature Hereford breed. Applicants must be MHBA members in good standing. Grants are awarded quarterly within the first week of each quarter and are through a matching funds approach with up to \$250 funded by the Grants program.

Grant funding can be requested for the following activities:

- Youth Shows ribbons, trophies, buckles, etc.
- Educational clinics, workshops, educational materials
- Projects monies toward purchase of a youth project animal, hardship assistance, disaster relief assistance.

Applications are now being accepted for consideration for monies to be awarded in early April. You can find the Grant Requirements, Review Schedule and Application Form on the MHBA website under the MHYF section.

Applications received by the end of March (quarter 1) will be reviewed and awarded in early April. Funding is for needs in upcoming quarters only – if request is for a junior show in July, the application would need to be submitted no later than the end of June (quarter 2); if request is for an educational workshop scheduled in November, the application would need to be submitted no later than the end of September. Grants cannot be awarded for past shows, events or activities.



How Can You Help?

As is the case with most organization activities, your help is needed to support the MHYF Grant program. Here's how you can help:

- Volunteer to be on the Grant Committee. The committee is chaired by the Director of Grants and will assist in the procurement of Grant funds, the development/maintenance of applications and criteria, the disbursement of funds and any other duties requested by the Grant Committee Chairperson.

Livestock Bill of Sale

A bill of sale is used to transfer the ownership of personal property, including cattle, and ensures both the buyer and seller that transfer and payment will take place smoothly. It is especially important when the livestock will be transported across state lines. ¹

The document includes information such as transaction price, information about the buyer and seller, details about the animal, health history, and vet clearance, etc. All livestock transactions should include a livestock bill of sale as evidence not only of ownership but, as proof of the actual transaction in case of any dispute regarding taxation or other legal matters.

A bill of sale is necessary for the following reasons: 2

Proof of transfers

The document contains all the details which pertain to the cattle and also displays the names of both the current and new owner

Future references

The livestock bill of sale can serves as a good reference for any future disputes if necessary or as back-up support when registering with a national organization such as the American Hereford Association or when a new owner wants to transfer the cattle to a third party.

Litigations and court cases

Occasionally a dispute may arise regarding the animals in question and the bill of sale. may be used to settle any disputes.

Taxation purposes

Many states and jurisdictions require payment of taxes whenever any property changes hands and information contained in the bill of sale may be used for taxation purposes.

The livestock bill of sale is an important legal document and proper attention must be given when drafting the document. The following should be taken into consideration for incorporation.

- A. The Transaction Date
- B. Details of Buyer and the Seller Information from a valid photo id such as a driver's license.
- C. The Livestock
 - 1. The animal's sex, date of birth and age.
 - 2. Estimated weight.
 - 3. List of vaccinations with dates.
 - 4. Veterinarian's certificate of health attached.
 - 5. Any other remarks or information pertaining to the animal.
- D. Purchase Terms

The agreed amount paid by the buyer along with the date of sale.

- E. Signatures of the Buyer and seller
 - 1. Buyer's and seller's proper signature with names printed underneath.
 - 2. The option of a notary if desired.

Johne's Disease

The Silent, Slow Killer

Johne's (pronounced "Yoh-nees") disease and paratuberculosis are two names for the same animal disease. Named after a German veterinarian, this fatal gastrointestinal disease was first clearly described in a dairy cow in 1895.

The disease primarily affects dairy cattle but also beef cattle! Although not as prevalent in the US as it was in the '70s it still exists and can decimate a herd, especially a small one. This deadly killer should be taken seriously and any time there is the purchase or sale of cattle under two years old, testing the dam a short time before the transfer of ownership is worth consideration. Speak with your veterinarian about Johne's Disease, it's fatal and there's no cure!

What causes Johne's disease?

A bacterium named Mycobacterium avium subspecies paratuberculosis (let's abbreviate that long name to "MAP") causes Johne's disease. The infection happens in the first few months of a calf 's life but the animal may stay healthy for a very long time. Symptoms of disease may not show up for many months to years later. This infection is contagious, which means it can spread from one animal to another, and from one species to another (cows to goats, goats to sheep, etc.).

The following is excerpted from the Johne's Information Center, University of Wisconsin - Madison School of Veterinary Medicine, with kind permission from Dr. M.T. Collins DVM, PhD, DACVM.

Can Beef Cattle Get Johne's Disease?

"In 1997 the USDA conducted the first and only survey of U.S. beef cattle herds using a commercially available blood test (ELISA). They tested 10,372 cows in 380 herds finding that 7.9% of herds had 1 or more ELISA-positive cows. They also discovered that 92% of beef producers were either unaware of Johne's disease or recognized the name but knew little about it. Also worth noting about that survey is that 70% of surveyed herds were commercial cow-calf operations (average herd size 137 cows). The remainder were registered (purebred) herds or herds with a combination of both commercial and registered cattle."

How do Beef cattle get infected?

"Johne's disease typically enters a herd of animals when a MAP-infected, but healthy-looking, animal is purchased. This infected animal then sheds MAP bacteria onto the premises – perhaps onto

pasture or into water shared by its new herd mates. Contaminated ponds, low-lying areas on farms that trap rainwater, are particular concern as they catch pasture runoff and become a "poop-soup" where MAP bacteria can persist."

"Young animals are far more susceptible to infection than are adults: these calves swallow the organism along MAP-contaminated milk, water or feed. Often, MAP-contaminated milk is collected from the infected but healthy-appearing animals. The milk may become contaminated from the environment (manure-stained teats) or, in the advanced stages of the infection, the bacterium is shed directly into the milk. Animals may even have been infected before they are born (called in utero transmission). Thus the infection spreads, often without the owner's being aware of it."

Can Johne's disease be cured?

"No. In the few studies that attempted to treat Johne's disease with antibiotics, symptoms appeared to subside but animals relapsed after therapy was halted. As with other mycobacterial infections (for instance, human tuberculosis) multiple antibiotics must be injected or given orally daily for months. For most animals, this is cost-prohibitive as well as not feasible because the required drugs are not legal for use in food-producing animals."

How do you control Johne's disease?

"The best methods for MAP infection control in your herd depend on the resources available, the goals of your enterprise, and the methods you use to take care of your cows. All control methods however rely on two core strategies that must be employed at the same time:"

- 1. "Calves must be protected from infection by being born and raised in a clean environment. The primary sources of MAP contamination are manure and/or milk from an infected adult animal. Moving the cow-calf pair out of the calving areas soon as possible limits exposure of calves to manure from other potentially MAP-infected cows and lessens the chances for cross-nursing."
- 2. "Adult animals infected with MAP must be identified and culled or at least kept out of the primary calving area to ensure no calves are exposed to their milk or manure."






