Johne's Disease

The Silent, Slow Killer

Johne's (pronounced "Yoh-nees") disease and paratuberculosis are two names for the same animal disease. Named after a German veterinarian, this fatal gastrointestinal disease was first clearly described in a dairy cow in 1895.

The disease primarily affects dairy cattle but also beef cattle! Although not as prevalent in the US as it was in the '70s it still exists and can decimate a herd, especially a small one. This deadly killer should be taken seriously and any time there is the purchase or sale of cattle under two years old, testing the dam a short time before the transfer of ownership is worth consideration. Speak with your veterinarian about Johne's Disease, it's fatal and there's no cure!

What causes Johne's disease?

A bacterium named Mycobacterium avium subspecies paratuberculosis (let's abbreviate that long name to "MAP") causes Johne's disease. The infection happens in the first few months of a calf 's life but the animal may stay healthy for a very long time. Symptoms of disease may not show up for many months to years later. This infection is contagious, which means it can spread from one animal to another, and from one species to another (cows to goats, goats to sheep, etc.).

The following is excerpted from the Johne's Information Center, University of Wisconsin - Madison School of Veterinary Medicine, with kind permission from Dr. M.T. Collins DVM, PhD, DACVM.

Can Beef Cattle Get Johne's Disease?

"In 1997 the USDA conducted the first and only survey of U.S. beef cattle herds using a commercially available blood test (ELISA). They tested 10,372 cows in 380 herds finding that 7.9% of herds had 1 or more ELISA-positive cows. They also discovered that 92% of beef producers were either unaware of Johne's disease or recognized the name but knew little about it. Also worth noting about that survey is that 70% of surveyed herds were commercial cow-calf operations (average herd size 137 cows). The remainder were registered (purebred) herds or herds with a combination of both commercial and registered cattle."

How do Beef cattle get infected?

"Johne's disease typically enters a herd of animals when a MAP-infected, but healthy-looking, animal is purchased. This infected animal then sheds MAP bacteria onto the premises – perhaps onto

pasture or into water shared by its new herd mates. Contaminated ponds, low-lying areas on farms that trap rainwater, are particular concern as they catch pasture runoff and become a "poop-soup" where MAP bacteria can persist."

"Young animals are far more susceptible to infection than are adults: these calves swallow the organism along MAP-contaminated milk, water or feed. Often, MAP-contaminated milk is collected from the infected but healthy-appearing animals. The milk may become contaminated from the environment (manure-stained teats) or, in the advanced stages of the infection, the bacterium is shed directly into the milk. Animals may even have been infected before they are born (called in utero transmission). Thus the infection spreads, often without the owner's being aware of it."

Can Johne's disease be cured?

"No. In the few studies that attempted to treat Johne's disease with antibiotics, symptoms appeared to subside but animals relapsed after therapy was halted. As with other mycobacterial infections (for instance, human tuberculosis) multiple antibiotics must be injected or given orally daily for months. For most animals, this is cost-prohibitive as well as not feasible because the required drugs are not legal for use in food-producing animals."

How do you control Johne's disease?

"The best methods for MAP infection control in your herd depend on the resources available, the goals of your enterprise, and the methods you use to take care of your cows. All control methods however rely on two core strategies that must be employed at the same time:"

- 1. "Calves must be protected from infection by being born and raised in a clean environment. The primary sources of MAP contamination are manure and/or milk from an infected adult animal. Moving the cow-calf pair out of the calving areas soon as possible limits exposure of calves to manure from other potentially MAP-infected cows and lessens the chances for cross-nursing."
- 2. "Adult animals infected with MAP must be identified and culled or at least kept out of the primary calving area to ensure no calves are exposed to their milk or manure."

Grant Awarded

An MHYF Grant of \$250 was recently awarded to the Colorado Cattle Battle Series Keenesburg Show. The funds will be used to help pay for awards and the show facility.

Reminder: Grants are awarded quarterly within the first week of each quarter and are through a matching funds approach with up to \$250 funded by the Grants program. Grant funding can be requested for the following activities:

- Youth Shows ribbons, trophies, buckles, etc.
- Educational clinics, workshops, educational materials
- Projects monies toward purchase of a youth project animal, hardship assistance, disaster relief assistance.

Applications are now being accepted for consideration for monies to be awarded in early July. You can find the Grant Requirements, Review Schedule and Application Form on the MHBA website under Grants in the MHYF section.

Applications received by the end of June (quarter 2) will be reviewed and awarded in early July. Funding is for needs in upcoming quarters only. Grants cannot be awarded for past shows, events or activities.

Grant Committee Volunteers Needed

The committee is chaired by the Director of Grants and will assist in the procurement of Grant funds, the development/maintenance of applications and criteria, the disbursement of funds and any other duties requested by the Grant Committee Chairperson. 

PKAN disease. Nick is dedicated to giving Amelia the best life possible, despite this debilitating disease. Watching these two together will melt your heart as you watch their special connection and the love and joy they share.

PKAN is a rare disorder caused by mutations in the PANK2 gene. It is the most common form of NBIA disorders (Neurodegeneration with Brain Iron Accumulation). Children diagnosed with PKAN usually have a more rapid progression of symptoms. Initially, they can be perceived as clumsy and later develop more noticeable problems with walking. Most cases of PKAN result in requiring a wheelchair by their mid-teens due to the inability to move or walk independently. Symptoms could also include poor vision or complete vision loss. With no known cure, this disease is slowly overtaking Amelia's body. Her condition has progressed to the point that she can no longer talk, but is still very aware of everything going on around her. While she is able to walk with assistance, she spends much of her time in a wheelchair. Doctors gave Amelia an expected life span of 10 years, but she has defied the odds by celebrating her 11th birthday in April.

When the MHBA and MHYF heard Amelia's story, we immediately knew we needed to help make Amelia's dream come true. We needed to find a way to get Nick and Amelia to Duncan, Oklahoma for the Miniature Hereford Junior Nationals. Amelia's story and our goal of sending her to Junior Nationals was posted on Facebook, was liked and shared by many of you and ended up reaching over 50,000 people. What an amazing testament to the support of the cattle community that reached far beyond our Miniature Hereford family!

Breeders' World Online Sales helped us by posting a donation tab on the Junior Nationals online auction. During the auction and in the hours and days that followed, we received amazing support and were able to raise enough funds to fully pay for Nick and Amelia's airfare, hotel, car rental and meals. Well Spring is here and so are the flies. Our prevention program involves three areas. First is a good Pinkeye vaccine typically given in April. Second is the start of putting out weekly Fly Eliminators on our pastures and corrall areas which breaks the fly cycle and stops 95% of all flies. And thirdly is general poop removal into a composting pile. Pinkeye is an evolving enemy that has shown itself even in the winter with different strains. But normally coming out in the Spring and early summer. So check every cow every day to make sure there's no eye tearing which could be that first sign of Pinkeye. Catching early is half the battle. Treatment can be two fold. Normally a good antibiotic like LA 200, and a topical ointment that we use called Today which is really used for mastitis. Using Today once a day for three days normally takes care of the Pinkeye, but one shot of antibiotic is an easier way for treatment. Good luck with those pesky flies!


